

What Items to Bring for Boarding/Daycare

- IDENTIFICATION - Always have current identification and collar and/or harness on your pet. A microchip is great, but an ID tag is faster!
- VETERINARIAN INFORMATION
- VACCINATION RECORDS - Bring copies of current vaccinations (rabies, Bordetella, DHLPP)
- FOOD & TREATS - Pack enough of your pet's normal food to last the entire trip plus an extra day in case your travel plans are delayed. Provide instructions on how much and how often they eat in a day. For convenience and accuracy, it is preferable to have each meal sealed in its own Zip Lock bag, but it is not mandatory.
- BEDDING & FAVORITE TOY - Bring your pet's bed and/or familiar towel, blanket, or toy to help make your pet feel at home. I can provide beds if you prefer not to transport your pet's bed.
- COLLAR, HARNESS, LEASH
- MEDICATIONS - Bring medications and full instructions on how to feed and medicate your pet. If your pet uses more than 2 pills a day, consider putting them in a daily pill container.
- SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS/CONCERNS - Make note of any allergies and/or medical concerns.
- CONTACT INFORMATION - Where you will be while out of town
- EMERGENCY CONTACT - Preferably a local contact
- CRATE OR HARNESS FOR TRAVELING - Invest in and use a crate and/or harness for the safety of your pet and family when traveling. I can provide crates and harnesses if you prefer not to transport them.
- BOWLS – Optional as I have plenty of bowls.
- LIST OF ANY PET'S LIKES AND DISLIKES THAT YOU WANT ME TO KNOW.
- LIST OF ANY QUIRKS - (for example: gets nervous during thunderstorms, loves to dig in trash cans, any things to be aware of when walking on leash, etc.)

- INFORMATION ABOUT PET'S BATHROOM SCHEDULE
- GROOMING SUPPLIES if pet needs to be brushed every day or every other day.
